St. Paul's Vestry Notes from March meeting

Priest's Report:

- Will consecrate the altar candles given in memory of Teeny Fritz and altar linens given in memory of Ann Brandt on Pentecost Sunday in May
- Discussed Holy Week schedule
- Christ Memorial has called a new priest, Rev. Lisa Work
- Allison's Installation Service update: service will be April 28 at 10:30 with luncheon to follow.

Treasurer's Report

Balance sheet

- Trust investments are up.
- Trust dividends are typical amount.

Budget report

- Carryover amount is different from budget because both assets and liabilities were not included in the January budget, and has been corrected
- Our accounting software has been changed from PowerChurchPlus desktop to PCP online. Susan and Bruce are working with the differences in software.
- Pledges appear to be behind but may be due to budgeting formula, will know better at end of quarter.

Old Business

Live streaming grant discussion—deferred to the June Vestry meeting

- Based on not getting a \$20,000 grant from the Diocese, Victoria raised the question of how we want to proceed with the project, to move forward or not. Victoria expressed a desire to have someone else be in charge of a Capital Campaign if we move forward.
- To keep communication open with the Diocese as they work on funding streams to include live streaming, Linda and Karen will work with Victoria to keep the conversation going with Chad Linder. Diocesan Finance Committee will be discussing the issue in May.

New Business

- Additional committees are needed to implement the Strategic Plan: Publicity
 Facilities. (Need a Facilities Manager as point person)
 Creation Care—looking for additional members.
 Committees need a point person to liase with designated Vestry member
- Bloomopoly game has come out. It is a fundraiser for Bloomsburg Singers. Vestry allocated monies to support the development of the game and has a space on the board. We can order games from Bruce Candlish or purchase them at The Exchange.

Committee Reports:

- Christian Education: Sunday evening group is finishing Acts of the Apostles.
 Susie will be starting class on Galatians for both Sunday and Monday groups.
- Outreach:
 - CMEC February 25 Outreach meeting: We are hoping Parish life is willing to join with Outreach again to participate in the 12-week Getting Ahead/Connections program next fall. We would provide one meal for the participants and 25 gift cards. Once the dates for the class are available, we can choose one that works with our schedules.
 - Another way to get information out to the congregation about Vestry committees (what their committee do and how to get involved) is to put it in the newsletter. Outreach submitted their handout for the March newsletter. Now we are asking the other committees to take a turn showcasing what they do.

- Panther Packs: Overall, we collected 36 bags of kid-friendly food and over \$500 in monetary donations from the congregation. Outreach matched \$500 of the congregation's donations for a total donation of 36 bags of food and over \$1000.
- Renaissance Jamboree: The next big event (Fundraising & Outreach) will be 2024 Ren Jam - Saturday, April 27 in downtown Bloomsburg. The first week of April we will have sign-up sheets for volunteers to help with: baking, cleaning strawberries, setup/teardown, serving, and clean-up. For this year, we have offered our 2nd space to the BU Pre-Med Science Club to use for fundraising or information distribution. They are a non-profit, so they will not generate any funds for St. Paul's, but they have participated in OOM dessert mission & regularly reach out to offer help with projects.
- OOM Dessert Mission: As of now we still have 2 dates open for OOM dessert ministry: June 9 & June 23.
- Parish Life: There will be a coffee hour after church on Easter Sunday in conjunction with Easter Egg Hunt
- Shaped By Faith: Will have more to say by May; sharing of ideas with Strategic Planning, Worship and CMEC

Galatians next topic For Christian Education

The next Adult Ed program at St. Paul's is a 7-week study of *The Epistle to the Galatians*. It starts the week after Easter. As one of the first of the Christian writings, pre-dating the Gospels, *Galatians* reveals an early, though not primitive, understanding of what was accomplished by the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

We are going to approach the study in a guided but investigative manner. It's a fun way to maneuver through Bible passages that reveals information not immediately obvious otherwise. Booklets will be provided. You need only to bring color pencils, a pen and have a Bible nearby. There will be a bit of homework, probably just for the first two meetings.

Our Liturgy under a microscope!

The Western church has a rich history for excellent and meaningful worship. We all could probably recite and sing most of the liturgy without our hymnals or the book of common prayer. But did we ever think about where the liturgy came from? Our liturgy is rooted in the holy scriptures and below is a detailed look into each part of the mass.

The Lord Have Mercy (Kyrie Elleison) repeats the words of the ten lepers in Luke 17:13. Jesus, Master, have mercy on us! We use the Kyrie for the seasons of Advent and Lent.

We echo the singing angels in the **Glory to God** (Gloria in Excelsis) with Luke 2:14. Glory to
God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace
among those whom he favors!

Finally, the **Salutation** comes from both Old and New Testaments in Ruth 2:4 and Luke 1:28. The Lord is with you.

And this is how much Bible you have received before we ever get to our readings from the Bible. We have four readings—a first and second lesson, a psalm and a gospel reading. We read from the Bible to continue to root ourselves in God's Holy Word. The very foundation of our lives comes from God's Word. And as is stated in Matthew 4:4, One does not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God.

Our **Great Thanksgiving** echoes the words of Psalm 136. It is right to Give Him thanks and praise.

The Holy, Holy, Holy (Sanctus) are the words of the angels in Isaiah 6:3. Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory. And Matthew 21:9 as part of the Palm Parade celebration. Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest heaven!

The Words of Institution come right from 1 Corinthians 11:23-26. The Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took a loaf of bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body that is for you. Do this in remembrance of me." In the same way, he took the cup also, after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

We pray the words of the **Lord's Prayer** that are given to us both in Luke 11:1-4 and Matthew 6:9-13.

And we begin our Eucharistic Meal with singing the words of John the Baptist, **the Lamb of God** (Agnus Dei), in John 1:29. Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!

I urge everyone to reflect more on these parts of the mass the next time you worship.

Safe church, safe communities

"Safe Church, Safe Communities" is the newly revamped, module-based training program of the Episcopal Church.

From the Diocesan website:

"Safe Church, Safe Communities" . . . (is a) comprehensive training approach, rooted in our Baptismal covenant, that encompasses issues of power, ethics, boundaries, and inclusivity to create safe spaces for all, especially children and vulnerable adults."

While many positions within St. Paul's require completion of certain module courses, if a person even has the combination for the church door, then the diocese says that person is responsible to take several modules. Having gone through the program, I would suggest all members think about becoming familiar with the material as it is about keeping each other safe.

While the no-cost classes can be taken online, I will start offering a module or two at a time on the first Sunday of the month, immediately after both the 8 o'clock and 10:30 services. The first offering will be on Sunday, April 7th. I hope to finish each session in 30 to 40 minutes.
